### Chris Lee

Associate Professor Christopher Lee works in private practise and has an adjunct appointments at the University of Western Australia and Murdoch University. He is a certified trainer by both the EMDR international association and the international society of schema therapists. He has published research over 50 articles and has had over 2000 citations. He has received an International Society for Traumatic Stress Studies and EMDRIA awards for research excellence in 1999 and 2014. In 2009 he also received the Inaugural Francine Shapiro award for research excellence conferred by the European EMDRIA. In 2011 he received a special recognition award from EMDRIA for his work on having EMDR officially recognised by Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration in the USA. In 2011 he was also the recipient of the Australian Psychological Society's Ian Campbell memorial award for contributions to Clinical Psychology in Australia.



### Peter Lieberman

Specialist in Psychiatry and Psychotherapy, EMDR-Trainer (EMDR Europe)  
Private practice in Leverkusen. Part of the EMDR Trainer Cooperation Training Association. Co-founder of the German speaking Society for Psychotraumatology (DeGPT) and several years of board activity, Deputy head of the working group 'acute traumatisation' of DeGPT. Founding member and board member of EMDRIA Germany, President 2005-2012 . Treasurer EMDR Europe. Lecturer at various psychotherapeutic training institutions and member of the steering group of the German PTSD guideline.

### Arne Hofmann

Dr. Arne Hofmann MD is specialist for psychosomatic medicine and head of the EMDR-Institute in Germany. He learned EMDR in 1991 and has introduced it in the german-speaking countries. Dr. Hofmann is co-founding board member of EMDR Europe and a member of a German national guideline commission on the treatment of PTSD. He is teaching, researching and publishing in the field of psychological trauma and EMDR. He has been teaching at the Universities of Cologne, Boston University and the Peking University and co-founded the European EDEN research group. For his work has received several awards and the Order of Merit of the Federal Republic of Germany.



### Jonathan Lee

Senior Lecturer in School of Psychology at the University of Birmingham and Researcher  
Jonathan Lee is a basic research behavioural neuroscientist interested in the mechanisms underlying the persistence of long-term memories. PhD in Experimental Psychology, University of Cambridge, where he has been a Lecturer, he moved to the University of Birmingham in 2008, where he is now Senior Lecturer in School of Psychology, and promising researcher of the Memory and Learning Group. He has published in Peer Reviewed Journals 38 papers. His current research focusses on the potential targeting of the memory destabilisation-reconsolidation process to reduce the impact of traumatic and addictive drug memories on anxious and drug-seeking behaviours.
